

"Awesome & Amazing Rounds"

- 34 year old male brought in with federal guard at 1700
- In waiting room with "withdrawal" triage code
- He had refugee status and was picked up with charges
- No opioid since arrest 2 days before, in withdrawal, begging for relief
- Suboxone induction and RAAC connection





"Awesome & Amazing Rounds"

- 36 yo male came in seeking support for opioid withdrawal, last used fentanyl 28 hours ago
- Currently staying in shelter, life had "fallen apart"
- Was in discomfort- COWS 10 initially, very nauseous
- Was provided gravol; 1 hours later COWS 13 and suboxone 2 mg administered
- BTG kit given and discharged back to shelter
- On bup/nlx 30 days later
