





All storyboards will be reviewed by a panel of judges and winners will be announced during Friday's lunch.




MODERATOR Steven Lewis

Steven Lewis is a health policy and research consultant based in Saskatoon and Adjunct Professor of Health Policy at Simon Fraser University.

Prior to resuming a full-time consulting practice he headed a health research granting agency and spent 7 years as CEO of the Health Services Utilization and Research Commission in Saskatchewan. He has served on various boards and committees, including the Governing Council of the Canadian Institutes of Health Research, the Saskatchewan Health Quality Council, the Health Council of Canada, and the editorial boards of several journals, including Open Medicine. He writes frequently on improving quality, equity, and performance in health care, and is the moderator of M.A.S.H. blog – Meaningful Analogies in Sports and Health.



Robert Francis

Chair, Mid Staffordshire NHS Foundation Trust Public Inquiry

PATIENT-CENTRED CULTURE: HOW TO GET IT AND WHAT TO AVOID – AN EXPERIENCE OF THE NHS Thursday, February 27 0825 – 0915

Robert Francis QC has been a barrister since 1973. He specialises in medical law, including medical treatment and capacity issues, clinical and professional negligence discipline, and health care regulation. He has been involved in many leading cases in this field.

He has been involved in many health care related inquiries. These have included chairing a number of inquiries into the care and treatment of mental health service users who have committed homicide. He appeared at the Bristol Royal Infirmary Inquiry, the Royal Liverpool Children's Inquiry, and the Neale Inquiry. He chaired the Independent Inquiry into the care provided by the Mid Staffordshire NHS Foundation Trust, and subsequently the Mid Staffordshire NHS Foundation Trust.

Robert has acted as legal assessor to the professional conduct committees of the General Optical Council and the Chartered Society of Physiotherapists and as legal adviser to the licensing committee of the Human Fertilisation and Embryology Authority. He is a Recorder [part time judge], qualified to sit as a deputy High Court Judge, and is a governing Bencher of his Inn of Court, the Inner Temple where he is currently chairman of its Education and Training Committee. He was a member of the Neuberger Entry to the Bar Working Party which explored means of promoting social mobility in recruitment to the Bar. He is a member of the Clinical Disputes Forum, a body which brings together stakeholders interested in improving the legal and complaints processes in health care. He is a past Chairman of the Professional Negligence Bar Association and is a consultant editor of the Medical Law Reports. He is co-author of Medical Treatment Decisions and the Law (Francis & Johnston: Butterworths 2001, 2nd edition 2009). For 9 years he was co-head of Serjeants' Inn Chambers where he still practises.

Dave deBronkart

Author, Health Policy Adviser and International Keynote Speaker

LET PATIENTS HELP HEAL HEALTH CARE

Thursday, February 27 1605 – 1700

Dave deBronkart, known on the internet as e-Patient Dave, is the author of the highly rated Let Patients Help: A Patient Engagement Handbook. After beating stage IV kidney cancer in 2007 he became a blogger, health policy adviser and international keynote speaker. An accomplished speaker in his professional life before cancer, he is today the best-known spokesman

for the patient engagement movement, attending over 200 conferences and policy meetings internationally in the past two years, including testifying in Washington for patient access to the medical record under Meaningful Use.

A co-founder and board member of the Society for Participatory Medicine, e-Patient Dave has appeared in Time, U.S. News, USA Today, Wired, MIT Technology Review, and the HealthLeaders cover story "Patient of the Future," and his writings have been published in the British Medical Journal, the Society for General Internal Medicine Forum, and the conference journal of the American Society for Clinical Oncology. In 2009 HealthLeaders named him and his doctor to their annual list of "20 People Who Make Healthcare Better."

Dave's TED Talk *Let Patients Help* has gone viral, in the top half of the most viewed TED Talks of all time, with over half a million views; volunteers have added subtitles in 26 languages, indicating the global appeal of his message, and in 2012 the National Library of Medicine announced that it's capturing his blog in its History of Medicine Division.



Dr. Leitch has worked for the Scottish Government since 2007 and is now the Clinical Director of the Quality Unit in the Health and Social Care Directorate. He is a member of the Health and Social Care Management Board and one of the senior team responsible for implementation of the NHSScotland Quality Strategy. He is also the Medical Director of the Tayside Centre for Organisational Effectiveness and an Honorary Professor at the University of Dundee.

Dr. Leitch was the 2011 HFMA UK Clinician of the Year. He is a non-executive Board member of AQuA in the North-East of England. He was a 2005-06 Quality Improvement Fellow at the Institute for Healthcare Improvement, in Boston, sponsored by the Health Foundation. He is also a trustee of the UK wing of the Indian Rural Evangelical Fellowship which runs orphanages in southeast India.

Jason Leitch has a doctorate from the University of Glasgow, an MPH from Harvard and is a fellow of the Royal College of Surgeons of England, The Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Glasgow and the Royal College of Surgeons of Edinburgh. He is also a Fellow of the Higher Education Academy.





Bruce Kirkby

Award-Winning Explorer, Writer, and Photographer

ACHIEVING BREAKTHROUGH PERFORMANCE BEYOND THE COMFORT ZONE

Friday, February 28 1420 – 1510

Bruce Kirkby has been shot at in Borneo and taken hostage in Ethiopia; he has survived crocodile attacks on the Nile and weathered high-altitude storms in Alaska. Offering mesmerizing stories based on 20 years as an explorer, writer, and photographer, he encourages audiences to get out of their comfort zones, think creatively, and take calculated risks. A weekly columnist with The Globe and Mail, his belief in human potential is contagious.

Bruce's journeys span 80 countries—and include some of the wildest corners of the planet. He has crossed Iceland by foot, explored Mongolia on horseback, traversed Arabia on a camel, and was captured by the Myanmar army while on assignment. Adding to his adventure, he has leapt from planes, dove with sharks, and fought off Nile crocodiles (using a damp copy of the Utne Reader).

In addition to his writing with The Globe and Mail, Bruce is a contributing editor for Explore, as well as a bestselling author; his work also regularly appears in Canadian Geographic, Outside Magazine, and Time. He is an award-winning photographer, and the former host of CBC's No Opportunity Wasted.
